## SILVER LINE TO LOGAN

Take the SILVER LINE (SL1) from South Station (connections to the Red Line and Commuter Rails), Courthouse Station, World Trade Center Station or Silver Line Way DIRECTLY to your airline terminal! Save time and money by avoiding traffic and tolls, compared to taking a taxi. Cost is \$1.70/person each way. ## SALEM - BOSTON FERRY: FREE RIDES OCTOBER 8<sup>th</sup>!

The Salem - Boston ferry offers service from Blaney Street in Salem to the Seaport World Trade Center dock and Central Wharf at the New England Aquarium with the following weekday commuter trips:

- Departing Salem at 7:00 am;
- Departing Boston's Long Wharf at 5:10 pm and 7:10 pm
- Departing Seaport World Trade Center at 5:25 pm and 7:25 pm.

## FLEXTIME and TELECOMMUTE OPTIONS

Shifting your commute time by just 30 minutes earlier/later may allow you to "miss" traffic or the crowds on MBTA vehicles during rush hour and still get to and from work at a reasonable time. For those employees who have a flexible schedule, this is a viable alternative to sitting in traffic or squeezing onto transit.

Some employers allow for telecommuting or working in other office locations. If you have the option to telecommute please consider doing so on the days that the temporary detours/road closures will be in place.

## PRIVATE BUS SERVICE TO BOSTON

Many commuters enjoy the comfort and convenience of private commuter bus services when traveling to and from Boston and/or MBTA Stations. These commuters read, work, and relax while someone else worries about switching lanes, accidents on the road, filling up the gas tank and more. A network of private bus carriers make frequent, daily trips between Boston and a number of Massachusetts towns. Bridgewater, Brockton, Haverhill, Marlborough, Manchester (NH), Newburyport, Southborough and Taunton are just a few of the communities served. Dozens of other cities are also serviced by major private bus carriers.
